“AgriFoods and Garden Show 2016”

The Newfoundland and Labrador Federation of Agriculture (NLFA) is pleased to announce the annual Agrifoods and Garden Show will be taking place at the Corner Brook Civic Centre from September 23rd - 25th 2016. This event is the largest show of its kind in the province.

The show features exhibits from various sectors of the province’s agriculture industry. The show’s key objective is to promote our agriculture and agrifoods industry and increase awareness of the importance of the industry to our province. The farmers’ market features fresh vegetables, fruit, berries, and eggs. There are information sessions and cooking demonstrations using fresh local produce. The event also features attractions for kids including an agricultural spelling bee, a petting farm, an interactive milking cow, and a chick hatchery.

This year we are excited to sponsor the Family Outreach Resource Centre and we are donating \$1 from each admission ticket that is purchased. This money will be used by the centre to continue and expand on their community kitchen program.

“This event provides a tremendous opportunity for the public to meet farmers, see what the agriculture industry has to offer, and educate children about where their food comes from. This year’s agriculture awareness program will give Corner Brook area students in grades four and five a full day of agriculture related programming.
